Update from Staff on Potential EMS Station Locations and Alternatives

Council and staff had detailed discussion that included, but was not limited to:

- Presentation from Billy Gibson on potential EMS station locations
- Question on if the County has an in-house commercial appraiser
- Timeline of temporary location for Medic 1 lease
- Request of two additional 24 hours response crews
- Review of Heat Map
- Ideally would like to build a new station
- Projected population growth if building a new EMS Station
- Discussion on collaboration with Clemson University in the central/Clemson area
- Medic 1 is priority #1, remove construction
- Next priority is relocating to the east side of Easley, large enough to accommodate 10-15 years out. Next option, Pope Field Rd. Next option, Crosswell.
